## **GLOBAL EVENT TO BRING 18,000 STUDENTS TO KOREA IN JUNE 2007**

**Campus Crusade for Christ will bring 18,000 students from 100 countries to South Korea from June 30-July 5, 2007 for *CM 2007*, the largest global student missions event in its history.**

ORLANDO, FL, May 7, 2007 - *CM 2007* will bring together more than 18,000 college students from 100 countries to the largest global student missions event in the history of Campus Crusade for Christ. *Campus Mission 2007 (CM 2007)* will be held in Busan, South Korea from June 30-July 5. More than 1000 Americans are expected to attend *CM 2007*.

*CM 2007* is not simply a large conference. For thousands of college students, *CM 2007* will be the launching point for them to travel on to campuses across the globe where there is little or no known Christian community.

"I can think of only two events that could fill a stadium with students from 100 countries: World Cup soccer and a commitment to Jesus Christ. This summer the college world will shrink to the size of a stadium in Korea," says Tom Gooldy, *CM 2007* International Project Director.

*CM 2007* will be hosted by Korea Campus Crusade for Christ. KCCC will provide free room and board to each international college student who attends *CM 2007*. Korea has emerged in recent years as a significant source for new Christian missionaries being sent around the world.

"History shows that college students have been at the center of change in the world's societies regardless of race or culture," states Dr. Park Sung-Min, National Director of Korea Campus Crusade for Christ. "We look forward to welcoming the students of the world to Korea where they will be challenged to consider how God could use them to help bring His message of love to those students who have never heard it."

A key element of *CM 2007* is the ambitious strategy of encouraging students to adopt every campus in the world unreached by the message of Jesus. Teams of students will travel from Korea to far-flung campuses in major cities including Tokyo, Budapest, Johannesburg and Mexico City.

*CM 2007* will be held in the BEXCO Convention Center in Busan, South Korea from June 30-July 5, 2007. Main sessions conducted in English will be simultaneously translated into Korean with real time translations available by radio in most major languages.

Founded in 1951, Campus Crusade for Christ International is served by 27,000 full-time staff working in 190 countries. Campus Crusade seeks to show people how to know and experience God's love and plan for their lives.
